

Ministry Standards for The Protection of Youth & Vulnerable Adults

Intent of Ministry Standards

These ministry standards are intended to provide a safe environment for youth and vulnerable adults in a variety of circumstances. From time to time it may not be possible to fulfill the standard to the letter. Permission is granted to SoCal Mission Inn employees and volunteers in leadership to waive a standard with justification. If it is found that consistent fulfillment of a standard is not practicable, the matter shall be elevated to the Pastors of First Christian Church Orange for resolution or amendment of these standards.

Adult-Youth Ratios

For all activities, an adult-youth ratio of 1:5 shall be maintained, except that a ratio of 1:20 may apply to a classroom environment with youth above the age of 14.

In all cases, an employee or volunteer under the age of 18 working with minor children shall be under the supervision of an adult over the age of 21.

Employees or volunteer leaders under the age of 21 shall not supervise or lead a youth group in which the oldest participating minor is less than four years younger than the supervisor/leader.

Bathrooms and Out-of-the-Way Locations

The following practices shall apply to supervision of bathrooms and changing areas:

- 1. Minimize presence of diverse minor age groups at the same time.
- 2. No employee/volunteer shall enter with a single unrelated youth unless the entry door is ajar (propped open) in a way that the employee/volunteer can be observed by others.
- 3. Employees and volunteers in leadership are randomly check bathrooms to assure their security.
- 4. The following areas are off-limits: Fireside Room Storage areas

Transition and "Free" Time:

Due to the nature of out-of-town mission trips, youth will periodically not be engaged in a supervised activity led by SoCal Mission Inn. Supervision by adult leaders of youth groups shall be maintained during free time to minimize the opportunity for security breach or youth-on-youth incidents.

Transportation of Youth:

Each group is responsible for their own transportation.

Transportation of youth, whether in buses, vans, or private passenger vehicles, is a serious responsibility. Especially when utilizing private vehicles of employees and volunteers, utmost care shall be taken in view of the risks associated with managing transportation.

The following standards shall apply:

- No employee/ volunteer/ group leader shall transport a single minor that is not his/her own, except as may be required in an emergency with the approval of a supervisor. Communications shall be established to verify the whereabouts, expected arrival, and change of custody of the child.
- 2. Any driver operating a vehicle which holds 16 passengers or more, including the driver, shall possess a valid Commercial Driver License (CDL).
- 3. Adult-youth ratios shall be maintained and within the safe loading limits of the vehicles being used.
- 4. All passengers are to be seated and to use safety belts.
- 5. When passengers must disembark at a rest facility or destination, care shall be taken to obtain a headcount on arrival and departure. All passengers shall be required to complete a trip on the same vehicle to assure accountability.

Off-site Activities (Day Trips)

Off-site activities are the responsibility of each group's adult leaders. SoCal Mission Inn expects adult leaders to maintain the adult-youth ratio of 1:5 at all times during their week at SoCal Mission Inn, even when engaged in off-site activities. Some settings may be appropriate for an alternate arrangement; please consult SoCal Mission Inn staff/volunteer leaders. All other supervisory rules and expectations are to be made clear by the visiting group's leader.
